Info from the last **Development Workers Network** meeting at Rainbow Community Centre held on Tuesday 7th April 2015. 12.30pm to 2.30pm

This meeting is for front line staff from across the borough.

Marlena O'Donnell made a presentation about the Care Act 2014. Explaining the social care reforms, why they are needed, the main principles of the Act; how it brings together elements of about 30 other existing Acts; the fact that the national eligibility criteria are broader than the 'critical only' that Wokingham work on; what has been brought in this year and what will be brought in in 2016.

Andrew Price then made his presentation about the Integration of health and social care in Wokingham Borough. He spoke about the Better Care Fund and the 9 projects contained within it.

Cinnamon Faith Action Audit

The purpose of the faith audit in Wokingham and nationally is to provide evidence for both the social impact and the economic value of all that faith groups do in communities across the UK.

In Wokingham Borough we counted 330 projects, 87,047 beneficiaries in 2014, 3,042 volunteers and almost £2.8 million of financial value being provided by faith groups in the area. This shows that at a time when budget cuts, changes to benefits and rising housing costs are affecting many communities across the country, there are groups of committed and faith-driven individuals who are stepping into the gap. The Cinnamon Faith Action Audit has found that across the UK they give over £3 billion worth of time and resources annually to support those most in need through social action projects.

Faith in the Community who is the local sponsor and carried out the audit in Wokingham Borough are planning to hold an event in the autumn to highlight the results and explore key areas of learning that may come out of these.





Big Lottery

Awards for All gives groups an easy way to get small Lottery grants of between £300 and £10,000.

They want to fund projects which address the issues, needs and aspirations of local communities and people. They will fund a wide range of community projects aimed at developing skills, improving health, revitalising the local environment and enabling people to become more active citizens.

You can apply to Awards for All England if you are a community group, not for profit group, parish or town council, health body, or school.

You do not need to be a registered charity to apply.

You must have a bank account that requires at least two people to sign each cheque or withdrawal.

They will pay for activities that will benefit the community, including:

- putting on an event, activity or performance
- buying new equipment or materials
- running training courses
- setting up a pilot project or starting up a new group
- carrying out special repairs or conservation work
- paying expenses for volunteers, costs for sessional workers or professional fees
- transport costs.

The Tudor Trust

The Tudor Trust makes grants, and provides other types of support, to voluntary and community groups working in any part of the UK. They particularly want to help smaller, community-led organisations which work directly with people who are at the margins of society: organisations which support positive changes in people's lives and in their communities.

Many of their grants take the form of core funding: funding which goes towards the core costs of running an organisation, including salaries, overheads and day-to-day running costs. Sometimes they may look at offering unrestricted funding, through a grant which can be used entirely freely to further an organisation's charitable objectives.

They can also provide project grants, capital grants for buildings or equipment and grants to help strengthen your organisation. There is no maximum or minimum grant.

Tudor doesn't have specific funding programmes. Their focus is on smaller forward-looking groups, led by capable and committed people. Some of the other characteristics we are looking for include:

- Organisations working directly with people who are at the margins of society
- A focus on building stronger communities by overcoming isolation and fragmentation and encouraging inclusion, connection and integration
- Organisations which are embedded in their community and which can identify and channel the potential within that community – whether the local area or a 'community of interest'
- Organisations which can demonstrate that they listen to and are responsive to their users
- Organisations which are thoughtful in their use of resources and which foster community resilience in the face of environmental, economic or social change

Childcare Investment Readiness Fund

Businesses looking to expand their presence in the early years market will be boosted by a £500,000 Department for Education grant to help usher in the new culture through the childcare investment readiness fund.

The grant management of the fund will be delivered by Social Investment Business (SIB) who, over the last 3 years, have supported a range of charities and social enterprises to raise new social investment for the first time.

Eligibility

Childcare providers, VCS organisations and social enterprises.

What For?

Applications for the investment readiness fund will be assessed by an 'investment panel' made up of experts who will decide which bids would make future social investment most attractive to social investors.

The childcare investment readiness fund is modelled on the Cabinet Office's investment and contract readiness fund. It will support childcare providers with a proven track record to become more appealing to investors.

The Fund will provide grants to early years and childcare social enterprises for the purchase of specific capacity building support to help facilitate their growth and become more appealing to investors. Applicants must have a proven track record and the potential to expand their services into new locations.

They will be looking to make around 15 grants, with funded activities to be carried out over a period of 6 to 9 months and be completed before 31st March 2016.

How Much?

The Fund will offer grants of between £25,000 and £50,000 to purchase specialised investment readiness support to cover the costs of putting an investment readiness plan into action. The fund will offer specialised support from an approved investment readiness provider with a track record in supporting social ventures to secure investment.

Deadline - Deadline for submitting an application is noon on Friday July 17th.
