Happy 2016! We hope you all had a good Christmas and New Year, 2016 is here and we are already in February, I'm pretty sure it is going to be a busy year.

I'm going to start by talking about money and funding... Between 2009/10 and 2012/13, funding of the voluntary sector by local government across the country fell by £800m, according to the National Council for Voluntary Organisations' UK Civil Society Almanac 2015. Services in employment and training, culture, recreation and community development have been hit hardest.

The government says funding for local government will be maintained between 2015 and 2020. But the Local Government Association says declining central government funding means council budgets will fall by 6.7 per cent in real terms over the parliament. Smaller charities could suffer most. Some councils may cut funding for charities instead of working with them to transform services. In my role as National Policing lead for Child Protection and Abuse Investigation (CPAI) I am responsible for enhancing the policing response to a range of areas including Child Sexual Exploitation (CSE) across England and Wales. CSE has been subject to significant attention nationally due to a number of high profile investigations, research / Inquiry reports, and related media reporting all of which has culminated in it being designated a national threat.

I am consequently writing to you to request your support in providing information gathered from your services work on CSE. My secretariat in conjunction with colleagues from academia have developed a specific set of questions which we believe if populated will enable an enhanced level of understanding of the regional picture and a more effective response accordingly.

### **NCVO** - updates

Happy New Year. I hope 2016 is a good one for your organisation and your local sector, despite the challenges we're facing.

If you have a monthly or weekly bulletin that goes out to your local voluntary sector I'm hoping that you can highlight some new free resources.

We have rewritten or refreshed a great deal of the content on our KnowHow website relating to commissioning and contracting:

There's a new section on <u>commissioning</u>. This covers all aspects of the commissioning cycle and contracting - from deciding whether or not to bid through to writing successful pre-qualification questionnaires and tenders, and monitoring and evaluating public service delivery. It also explains some of the technical aspects of commissioning in detail, for example the law covering TUPE.

We've updated the section on <u>cultural commissioning</u> with a wealth of information and <u>case</u> <u>studies</u> showing how public bodies can commission arts and culture to deliver health and wellbeing and other outcomes for communities.

And we've added a section explaining <u>social investment</u> and all the different finance products that are available to charities and social enterprises.

Over the coming weeks I will be writing blog posts highlighting specific content, and my first post of 2016 is aimed at smaller organisations, and outlines some of the key things for voluntary organisations to be aware of when thinking about bidding for public service contracts.

Finally, related to this, NCVO is now an approved provider for <u>Big Potential (breakthrough route)</u> and <u>Big Potential (advanced route)</u>. We can support you or your local members to raise a development grant that will build capability either to attract social investment or £1M+ contracts.



### **Changing Place Toilet Facility**



We would like to let you know about the Changing Place toilet facility in Wokingham town centre. A Changing Place is a fully accessible toilet and personal care facility for people with disabilities and complex health needs and includes an adult sized changing table and hoist. Standard disabled toilets do not meet the needs of all people with disabilities or their carers which might mean they aren't able to leave their homes for long periods of time. The Changing Place facility allows these people to be more independent and take part in their community. Being a Green Action Trainee is a fantastic way to learn new skills, develop a knowledge base and undertake training. You will also meet new people, feel valued, have fun and get active.





The Care Quality Commission (CQC) is seeking views on its plans for the next five years as it develops its approach to regulation.

CQC has changed the way it works over the past three years and in its consultation document *Shaping the future*, published today, it sets out a vision for the future regulation of health and social care.

The way health and social care is delivered has changed and is continuing to change, with increasing numbers of acute NHS trusts providing social care, more GP federations, and technology playing a greater role in the way services are delivered coupled with the demographic challenge of increasing numbers of older people with needs that will be met by more than one service. In this consultation document, CQC sets out proposals that respond to these new ways of working.

CQC is also asking for views on its proposed approach to using data, which will support a risk-based approach to regulation. In turn, this will support a more targeted and tailored inspection programme that allows CQC to inspect services rated good and outstanding less frequently and to lend greater support to those performing less well.

Feedback from the consultation paper published last October indicated broad support for CQC's regulatory approach. Respondents said CQC should focus on areas such as working better with its partners and ensuring it stays on the side of the public and people who use services.

The consultation is open until 14 March. CQC will formally respond to the feedback provided when it publishes its strategy in May this year.

Projects over the past few years have involved; creating a new pond area for a centre that provides day relief for people with MS, painting for a charity shop in Wokingham, gardening for a cancer charity in Wokingham, creating a learning garden for a school in Wokingham, painting and gardening for a lunch club that supports the elderly and fixing and painting fences for sheltered accommodation in Wokingham.

However big or small the task you have, it may be perfect for a group of local employees. I have a couple of organisations currently looking for a task!

## No Cold Calling Zones - Update

Last January we started working with Trading Standards to set up No Cold Calling Zones in the Wokingham Borough area. We hoped to initially set up 10 schemes and we are very happy to say that to date we have set up 81 schemes plus 17 schemes pending including a fantastic scheme set up in Sonning Village with 652 premises.

Why set up NCCZ: We always advise residents never to engage with people selling goods or services on the doorstep. Also from time to time we send out messages about particular sellers involved in doorstep trading and who to look out for and types of business they may be running. Currently we are aware of Roofing|Property

Maintenance|Driveway companies who may do doorstep selling and/or a leaflet drop. Some companies have been operating in the Bracknell and West Berks area and if you have any information on these traders please let us know details.

What next: Obviously there are still many roads in the Wokingham Borough area who may not have heard of the No Cold Calling Scheme or maybe 2016 is the right time for your road to be a NCCZ.
